Botswana Railways Chief Executive Officer to attend SARA Rail Press Conference

DCEC officials caution BR employees

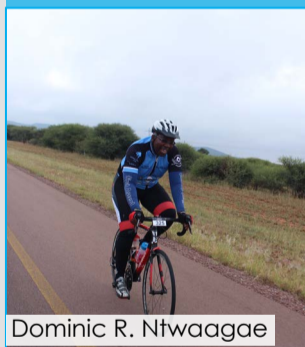
In the anti-corruption workshop held at Premier Hotel, Mahalapye on April 23 - 24 2015; the Chief Executive Officer of Botswana Railways Mr. Dominic Ntwaagae noted in a speech read on his behalf by Mr. Thabo Gabanamotse that corruption is a serious national concern and hence it needs a collective effort from all citizens including BR employees.

On his remarks he noted that corruption must be rooted out in all its forms. "We should form a formidable team that will effectively drive our organisation in attaining a zero corruption status, he added." Botswana Railways (BR) em-

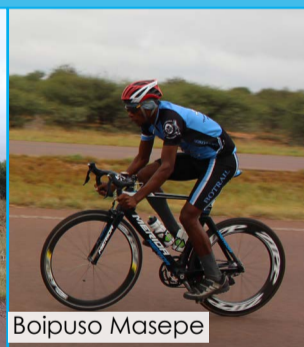
ployees were cautioned against promoting corrupt behaviour. Directorate on Corruption and Economic Crime (DCEC) officer, Ms Oratile Manamo, sounded the warning when addressing BR employees at the workshop. Ms. Manamo said that the Corruption and Economic Crime Act had been amended to strengthen the anti-corruption legislation to fight corruption related offences given the loopholes in the old act and increasing sophistication of corruption. "The act was further amended to address changes in operational processes as well as the environment, she added."



Botrail Cycling Club competed in the Neelano Open Road Race

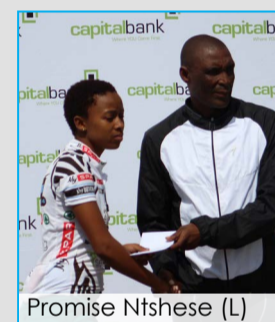

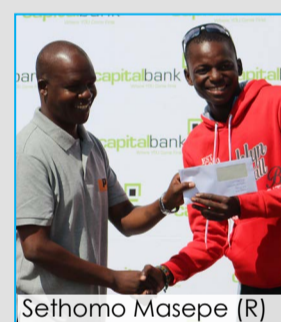
